

## Snowman

Taught by Nancy Genetti, adapted from a pattern of Chris Thornton's with her permission

The pattern is approximately 9" wide x 10" tall

Fabric - mine is on a lt. denim shirt - wash and dry fabric without softeners of any kind

When painting on fabric, I stretch the fabric around a 16 x 20 plastic covered canvas board. I then tape or clip the fabric to the board. I use another plastic bag over the entire surface, tape or clip and cut out just the painting area. This keeps you from getting paint where you don't want it!

Deco-Art So Soft Paints:

Transparent Medium

Christmas Red

Burgundy

White

True Blue

Navy

Antique Gold

Pottery Brown

Bright Yellow

Cadmium Orange

Christmas Green

Yellow Green

Hauser Dark Green

Burnt Umber

Black or Shimmering Pearl Charcoal

Opt. Glittering Topcoat - if you would like some sparkle

You can also substitute acrylic paints and fabric medium. The result will not be as soft but will not wash out.

The pattern can be applied with transfer paper and stylus or a charcoal pencil (white or black depending on color fabric) traced on the back of pattern and rubbed on surface.

I use soft white nylon brushes. You can also use regular fabric brushes. If you are using acrylics, you would want a stiffer brush to scrub paint into fabric.

Brushes used: #10 Round, #5 round, #3 round

Liner

1/2 flat or angle is optional

Large dome round or some kind of stipple brush

Regular painting supplies - water bucket, palette-either small bubble palette or regular paper palette, paper towels, tape.
